We took the first major step of our joint journey in 2020 in the proverbial heart of Europe. In Czechia, a country with a sense of craft and a rich glassmaking tradition, we, as natives of Liberec, have always been close to this multifaceted and fragile medium. Our hometown is located in the fabled North Bohemian "Crystal Valley", which has been synonymous with the beauty and quality of Czech glass for almost five centuries.

Our love for glass and many years of experience in designing and realisations have naturally resulted in the desire to materialise and present our own visions and original creations under our names. It could not have made more sense to establish a family business in a place with such a history – and Studio SALANSKY in Liberec was born.

Since then, under the SALANSKY brand, we have been designing and producing light objects, solitaires, and sculptures for interiors and exteriors. Our production and custom designs are mainly based on hand-blown or technical glass, which sometimes encounters other media such as wood, metal or stone. Based on your requirements, we can prepare a concept study for your chosen interior or exterior project and discuss the form of delivery. Our production takes place mainly in local glassworks and small artisan workshops but we are open to any kind of collaboration.

We can either do the preliminary calculation, production, delivery and installation ourselves or in collaboration with your architectural or design studio.

SALANSKY

Jan Salanský is an independent artist whose approach crosses the boundaries of cultures, languages, disciplines, and styles. He develops designs that either follow or break the typical crafting sequences and, at the same time, build upon traditional methods. His work focuses on detail and the raw form of the material being worked, depending on the context of place and time. Jan is a product of the Czech creative community from Podještědí.

He graduated from the High School of Furniture Design in Liberec. Subsequently, he enrolled at the Faculty of Art and Architecture at the Technical University also in Liberec where he completed his Master's degree in the Environmental Design studio under the supervision of Prof. Bořek Šípek. Currently, Jan is finishing his PhD studies at the same faculty, focused on glass production in the context of the environments that surround us. He has also gained valuable experience during his internships in Eindhoven, the Netherlands, which is famous for its local Design

Academy, or thanks to his long-term cooperation with Preciosa where he worked as a designer.

Ondřej Salanský graduated from the Secondary School of Mechanical Engineering where he acquired a flair for technical solutions. However, further paths led him to the product as such and then to study marketing at the Technical University in Liberec. He then gained work experience in a number of major companies focused on both product and corporate marketing.

After many years of collaboration on a number of projects, both academic- and production-wise, the dynamic brother duo founded the brand SALANSKY & Co. s.r.o. Under their joint banner, they create glass objects, applied design, interior and exterior installations, and exceptional works of art, bringing unique complex solutions and processes to the industry.

A specific aspect of our production are light glass installations and customised lighting designs based on an original approach. We do not produce pre-designed concepts – all production is based on our own creative input, ensuring a unique experience that truly reflects the needs of the customer and the given space.

Underground erupting directly from the Earth's glowing core. Roughly textured structures suggesting tectonic plate action. Imprints of soil, mineral ores and crust. All this can be read from the rugged surface of the Underground collection, providing us with a unique opportunity to uncover the secrets hidden beneath our feet. Unexpected shapes and structures, literally brought out into the light.

Crystal cylinders made of press-blown glass with a raw texture hide an almost mystical element. The luminaire can be made in a composition of several pieces of different parametres and arrangements in one of four available variations. 
Fluffy, rolling clouds have tempted us to let our imaginations run wild since childhood. To look for shapes others can't see.




The number and size of the luminaires is modifiable – Clouds can be fully customised to suit the interior. Also the colour scheme can be customised within the possibilities of available colours.

The Tubes luminaire is a horizontal decorated tube in sandblasted clear glass that can be customised thanks to the unique patterns placed around the surface. It works great in interiors both individually and in a set of several pieces.


The hand-blown hollow iridescent drops of crystal glass are suspended from segmented chains that evoke tiny droplets. A true solitaire that will flow serenely through any space.



Mikado is an example of how to combine different materials to achie- Material: TECHNICAL Glass, Stainless steel ve an unusual visual effect. This complex yet elegant sculpture is made of glass tubes and stainless steel, which gives it a unique character and appearance.

The glass tubes are combined together in such a way as to create geometric shapes that look both fragile and solid. The glass tubes are able to capture and reflect light perfectly, causing a wonderful sparkle. The frosted matt tubes, on the other hand, add contrast to the overall design and create an interesting play of light and shadow.




"I look into the clouds and see an endless story. I can imagine everything. The mirrored world offers new dimensions and planes, our surroundings in another reality."

The Cumulus Luxus installation hovers over the heads of observers as an illusory world that inspires and fascinates. It invites reverie, introspection and the slow flow of thoughts, not unlike the clouds.

The sculpture consists of 26 suspended clouds made of hand-blown glass. The organic-shaped glass components are silvered on the inside, so that they act as living mirrors set to their surroundings. The sculpture was installed in the foyer of the Liberec Castle as part of the Anifilm 2022 film festival.




















A medium such as glass never ceases to reveal new facets and layers. In addition to commissioned production, we also create our own collections. We craft these in relation to the context of the place, situation or environment they are designed for. Our collections include glass sculptures, utility glass or even solitaires, often in unique combinations with other materials. The completion of an original collection takes approximately three months – from the first sketch to the realisation itself.

Since time immemorial, we tend to fixate on things that are unique, hard to find, rare. These are the treasures of our Earth, the mineral wealth. Something that can only be acquired by effort and found by chance. Objects in which material beauty merges with the immaterial, stimulating the imagination.



It brings together elements from classic cast chandeliers with velvety white opal glass, creating a lively dialogue between these seemingly different worlds, which have been meeting in our homes for centuries.

The creation of the UNDERGROUND collection was based on the search for new processes, materials, and surprising results that utility glass can offer. The new glass formula with rare soil admixture offers a captivating experience day and night. In daylight, the products beckon to be touched, and after nightfall, when illuminated with UV light, they come to life and glow.

The UNDERGROUND collection is original, fun, and mysterious. The roughly textured press-blown glass stimulates both the gaze and the imagination.







Carefully processed materials bond into a solid protective shell for the little things you hold most dear. A hand-blown glass lens with cut transparencies protects everything hidden underneath, yet doesn't obstruct an admiring gaze. The wabi-sabi momentum of the wooden part hides the history of glass production while harmoniously complementing the other transparent half.

In the Minimum Maximum solitaire, one can notice the interplay of vertical and horizontal lines combined with the optical qualities of the glass lens and the character of the old oak glass mould.



The boundaries of experimental art are located between different fields of practice, at the points of their intersection – where life permeates art or even science. The essence of this approach is largely found in the act of experimentation itself and not only in its results and products. The malleability and ephemeral beauty of molten glass directly invites experimentation and the discovery of new forms.

Creating in an unexplored environment and scanning the space at a certain angle. A series that portrays objects in time.


The hand-blown glass captures their fossils, negative forms that have imprinted their likeness on the velvety white objects. What we see is a demonstrative absence.


TRANSFORMATION uses the archetypal objects of our civilisation as moulds and explores the environment in their close proximity.

The result is 13 different shapes that report on the existence of things in their absence.

In the creation of these objects, glass is given space for its natural behaviour, which is only minimally interfered with. This is not, however, incompatible with the possibility of taking it to extreme forms.



The Upholstery Collection is a set of three solitaires, namely the Toton armchair, chair number 07 and chair number 08.



All three artworks are primarily related by the combination of two materials. In the case of the Toton armchair, it is raw wood and blown glass, and with chairs 07 and 08, it is metal construction and blown glass. Each solitaire draws attention to itself through the different morphologies of either the bentwood furniture or the raw welding of the metal structures in both chairs. The collection is a showcase of unusual compositions and the use of remarkable techniques, visible both in the whole and in the detail.

The Toton chair is "upholstered" with two crystal hand-blown glass cushions. The elements are connected by crude brass wire, which ties the unique morphology tightly together.

Chair number 07 catches the eye with its vibrant aquamarine blue combined with the raw welding of the metal chair. The visible material dialogue underlines the aesthetic impression of the whole composition.

Hand-blown glass in a warm amber colour sits comfortably on chair 08, as if in a tight embrace of the raw welded construction. The distinctive combination of materials places the object in the role of an interior solitaire.









To awaken life, to lure out a shape and let it flow freely and stop it at the right moment. By kneading white opal glass, evoking a feeling of suppleness and softness that dissolves at the first touch.


The HOOK Vases series is created by free-form deformation using wooden hooks that were formerly used as clothes hangers. The brawl with the material results in organic shapes that act spatially not only as aesthetic pieces but also as functional objects.



Thanks to its versatility, glass can become a dominant feature of any space or, on the contrary, blend in naturally. Our projects are visions that have materialised only in one unique design and in one specific space where they are permanently placed. They relate to the atmosphere, history and requirements of the site and can even explore the limits of the possibilities of glass as a material.

You are entering another world. A street world where styles, cultures, opinions and tastes mix. There are layers and layers of time. Who's behind it, the free-wheeling artist or the vandal?

We designed and realised the large-scale painting in the basement of the Chicago restaurant in Liberec together with other artists from Walldesign3000 and artist Jakub Neufuss. The inspiration for the overall approach to the atypical space was a dark street of Chicago.

A kind of side street. A place that you just walk through quickly. But one that reflects the face and character of the city.

The corridor and the staircase transport you to Chicago nightlife that can't do without neon lights, various graffiti, a "burning" barrel or a winking bulb.









The term penetration is known across disciplines.


Whether as breaking through a defensive military line, penetration in the context of sexual activity or just as a coating that seeps into the material.

The sculpture PENETRATION 2021, created especially for the Liberec Castle, was intended as a breakthrough of energy that is rushing towards the surface. Our eyes tell us that it is frozen in time but the ears can almost hear the shattering of the bedrock and the clink of crystallising glass. The object brings together local materials within geology and history – the refined and raw masses of local Liberec granite and the icy crystal rods of glass that are intrinsically tied to the region.

Thus, a place to meet, encounter, rest, stop and contemplate comes to life. Culture is surging to the surface!





MADE TO MEASURE

Our portfolio also includes the design, specification and production of light objects, solitaires and sculptures for interiors. We design and manufacture objects primarily from hand-blown glass, occasionally in combination with other materials. All works are original and conceived to respect the story, character, function and atmosphere of the given space. Based on your requirements, we are able to prepare a conceptual proposal with sensitivity to contemporary design, a preliminary calculation and, last but not least, the production and installation itself.

- **1. Ideation** We will discuss in detail with the client their idea of the design, desired aesthetics, intended elements in the interior, colours, materials and final extent. In the first stage, it is important to focus on room dimensions, wiring, fixture/object placement, anchor points and ceiling technical design.
- **2. Sketch** The next step is the first proposal and conceptual design. This includes clarification of the concept and approach to the processing, material variations or first hand sketches.
- **3. Model** A 3D model or technical sketch is created for the intended and sketched object, luminaire or sculpture, which then serves as the technical basis for production.
- **4. Production** During the production process, we constantly consult the final product with the client. Before the actual installation, we have a pre-installation where they can see the product in our studio.
- **5. Installation** Installation is always by appointment and subject to approval of the final design.
